Important Information: The presentation should not be more than 4 minutes talk + 1 minute Q and A. All presenters need to carry the presentation in pen-drive in PPT format and submit them before the session in E-poster Screens. All presenters have to use the E-poster template. All presenters are requested to arrive 30 minutes before their session to avoid any last-minute inconvenience.

Below are the guidelines for E-poster session.

## General specifications:

- · There should be only ONE slide per E-poster.
- · File format should be Power point (.PPT/.PPTX).
- The PPT slide should be in landscape orientation in 16:9 ratio.
- The E-poster will be displayed on a standard 42" LCD TV.
- · Total size of the PPT slide should not exceed 5 MB.
- · Animation/movies/sounds will not be supported; please submit in a static PPT format only.

## Design specifications:

- The E-poster needs to be created as per suggestion under.
- The poster title should be displayed prominently at the top of the poster, followed by the presenting author name.
- The text should include Aim/ Objective, Methods, Results and Conclusion.
- The poster should be self-explanatory, text should be brief and well organized.
- The typeface/ font chosen should be a simple and clear one (Calibri only) minimum 11 points and maximum 20 points is a well-accepted font size.
- The correct font size depends greatly on the fonts used in the file and the thumb rule should be that if its visible well on the computer screen it shall be visible on the E-Poster Display Screen.

## **Colour suggestions:**

- · When using light backgrounds (white, yellow, light blue) we suggest using dark fonts (black & navy blue).
- · Avoid using red or green colour fonts or the background as they are colours that are difficult to be read.
- · Illustrations/ images/ photographs used in the E-poster should be enlarged enough to show relevant details.
